PROGRAM NOTES

Graduates are listed alphabetically under the degree they are receiving, Bachelor of Fine Arts, Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts. In some cases, a student may earn more than one bachelor's degree during his or her undergraduate years. The student's major(s) are listed to the right of his or her hometown, with a concentration indicated within parentheses. Directly below each name is the student's hometown. Titles of yearlong Senior Theses or Senior Creative Projects judged to merit recognition appear in italics underneath the hometown, along with the name and terminal degree of the faculty supervisor.

President's Medalists wear gold medals awarded in recognition of their status. Students graduating *summa cum laude*, *magna cum laude* and *cum laude* Latin honors wear gold, silver and red tassels respectively on their caps. Student members of Mortar Board, a national honor society that recognizes college seniors for their achievements in scholarship, leadership and service, also wear gold tassels on their caps.

Today's processions are selections chosen from *The Water Music* (1717) and *Music for the Royal Fireworks* (1749) by George Frideric Handel (1685-1759). The recessional is a selection from *String Quartet No. 7, K. 160* (1773) by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. *Fanfare for the Class of 2021* is an original composition by Associate Professor of Music HyeKyung Lee, B.M., M.M., D.M.A. Musical selections are being performed by Hanna Hurwitz, violin; Katherine Ji, violin; James Van

Reeth, violin; Corinne Keefer '21, violin; Nicole Harris '20, viola; Cora Kuyvenhoven, cello; Douglas Richeson, bass; Whitney Davis, trumpet; Julian Davis, trumpet; Allyson Krupa '21, horn; Ryan Hamilton, trombone; Thomas Hellman '21, euphonium. The commencement orchestra is conducted by Assistant Professor of Music Chris David Westover-Muñoz.

Flowers for the program are provided by Village Flower Basket. Interpretive signing is done by Hallenross and Associates, LLC. The program concludes when the platform party and faculty have recessed. The audience and graduates are asked to remain seated during the recessional.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

The academic costume which makes the Commencement procession so colorful is more than 800 years old, dating back to the days when students were members of the minor clergy and wore monkish gowns and hoods. Today, the hood is used only as an ornament. It is lined with the colors of the university conferring the degree: the border in which it is edged indicates the scholar's field. The colors seen in today's Denison procession and the fields they represent are: Dark Blue: Philosophy; White: Humanities; Golden Yellow: Science; Light Blue: Education; Brown: Fine Arts; Pink: Music; Silver Gray: Oratory (Speech); Scarlet: Theology; Lemon Yellow: Library Science; Sage Green: Physical Education; Drab: Commerce, Accountancy, Business.

RETIRING FACULTY

DAVID A. BAKER

B.S.E., M.A., CENTRAL MISSOURI STATE UNIVERSITY; PH.D., UNIVERSITY OF UTAH
PROFESSOR EMERITUS OF ENGLISH

Before turning pen to paper, David Baker began as a musician. When a course in modern poetry prompted him to start to write on the side, he simply realized he could make a different kind of music, trading guitar for pen.

After completing his undergraduate degree, Baker entered his career with an early foray into education. Following two years spent teaching public school English, he returned to higher education in pursuit of a Ph.D., where he focused on American literature with a creative approach.

Being from Missouri himself, Baker was passionate about teaching in the Midwest, and Denison offered both professional and geographic opportunity. He was drawn to the small class sizes, as well as the ability to teach while continuing to write and the chance to be part of a flourishing community of artist scholars. Baker holds the Thomas B. Fordham Chair of Creative Writing and was the Department of English chair in 2010.

His classes have ranged from creative and poetry writing to American and modern literature and poetic theory, inspiring a large number of students whom he hopes have gone on with a deeper sense of soul-making.

His work has garnered recognition from the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation, the National Endowment for the Arts, the Poetry Society of America, the Ohio Arts Council, and the Society of Midland Authors, among others.

David will most miss the sense of community and gathered vision at Denison. In retirement, he plans to return to the classroom occasionally for a few classes each spring. He hopes to travel, taking his skills on the road, and edit a long-awaited book on eco-poetry.

BRENDA MARIE BOYLE

PROFESSOR EMERITA OF ENGLISH

Brenda Boyle's interests span American literature of the 20th and 21st centuries, with a focus on issues of rhetoric, race, gender, sexuality, and disability, as well as war literature.

Family and personal experience with the military served formative, as she began her academic pursuits with an ROTC scholarship in Germany.

Boyle later pursued a master's degree in International Relations focused on Southeast Asia and UN Law of the Sea. She describes much of her scholarship as very cross-disciplinary, bringing in learnings and teachings from policymakers to political science.

Having attended a small liberal arts college herself, teaching at Denison offered a familiar environment. Previous time spent supporting first-year writing as a graduate student at Ohio State prompted her involvement with the Writing Center at Denison, eventually splitting her time between serving as director and teaching in the Department of English.

In the classroom, Boyle most appreciated the smaller class sizes, always preferring conversations over lectures. Within the Denison Writing Center, her role involved overseeing daily functions and training staff members to teach beyond simply writing acuity to include empathy, while always keeping a finger on the pulse of student involvement and engagement.

Boyle credits her time as a mentor of Posse students from Chicago in 2009 and 2019 among her richest experiences at Denison. As a mentor, she advised small groups of students who supported one another throughout their undergraduate careers and developed longstanding connections.

Similarly, she enjoyed the immersive experiences of serving on committees with colleagues, as well as co-teaching a Denison Seminar that studied Greek culture here before traveling to Greece over spring break.

In retirement, Brenda looks forward to spending time writing and in the company of family and furthering her scholarly pursuits in the congenial climes of California.

TOM C. BRESSOUD

B.S., MUSKINGUM UNIVERSITY; M.S. BOSTON UNIVERSITY, M.S., PH.D., CORNELL UNIVERSITY
PROFESSOR EMERITUS OF MATHEMATICS AND COMPUTER SCIENCE

Having known from a young age he wanted to be a scientist, Tom Bressoud pursued mathematics, the modeling language of science, as an undergraduate. He first completed his B.S. at Muskingum University, where he focused on both mathematics and computer science. He then went on to spend seven years at the Lincoln Laboratory at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, where he was instrumental in the design and build of a novel system for processing and visualizing radar data.

Research in the Marshall Islands then led to graduate school at Cornell University, where he pursued his Ph.D. in computer science with funded research. His work there that specialized in tolerance and distributed systems paved the way for today's modern use of virtual machines.

Following a successful career in industry, Bressoud came to Denison in 2002 with a breadth of experience. His background included working with a tech startup and computer and telecommunications companies, as well as working in research and advanced development. Additionally, he is the lead inventor on four U.S. patents and the author of numerous conference and journal publications.

For Bressoud, coming to teach at Denison was an intentional decision, as working within a liberal arts institution was always a goal. The school's interdisciplinary

environment was another attraction, and fittingly, Tom became instrumental in the proposal and creation of Denison's data analytics major. He has held the Benjamin Barney Chair of Mathematics and Computer Science since 2019 and will leave as part of his legacy his recently published textbook, "Introduction to Data Systems: Building from Python."

In the classroom and beyond, Tom's presence on campus has made computer science accessible to students studying a wide range of disciplines, from introductory courses exploring fundamental ideas to an "hour of code" to help non-CS majors understand the field further. His personal outreach has included work with First of Ohio and the local robotics community, as well as summers spent mentoring undergraduate research of students who have since gone on to co-author national papers.

Tom will most miss the experience of bringing students clarity in the classrooms of Denison, an atmosphere which he describes as genuinely thriving.

He credits the college's unique liberal arts setting as giving students the opportunity to meet and exceed elevated academic expectations. In retirement, he hopes to transition to new horizons that will allow him to continue to make an impact.

KIRK CLAYTON COMBE

B.A., DAVIDSON COLLEGE; M.A., MIDDLEBURY COLLEGE; D.PHIL., OXFORD UNIVERSITY
PROFESSOR EMERITUS OF ENGLISH

After receiving his B.A. in English from Davidson College in North Carolina, Kirk Combe went on to Middlebury College to pursue a master of arts degree. He later completed his Ph.D. at Oxford University in England, concentrating his time on Restoration and 18th-century British literature. An early intrigue with Shakespeare and his plays led to a career-long exploration of contextual satire, culminating in his status today as a widely recognized expert in the scholarly field.

His own undergraduate experience at a small college made Denison an attractive teaching environment, and, over the course of his teaching career here, Combe enjoyed feeling like his teaching and research were never separate. Exemplifying the persona of a teacher-scholar, his publications and scholarly pursuits continually fed his teaching, resulting in a richer classroom experience for his students.

On the Hill, Combe has taught popular culture and critical theory and literature, expanding his areas of specialization into British literature with an emphasis on stage comedy and satire.

Teaching accolades at Denison include the Charles A. Brickman Teaching Excellence Award, as well as being

selected for the Viola Kleindienst Endowed Professorship. Combe also served as an outside chair of the departments of theatre and modern languages for several years, and he was heavily involved with the formation of Denison's recently created Health, Exercise, and Sport Studies major.

Beyond Denison's campus, Combe's reach is represented by his publications that range from books and articles to short fiction in literary journals, as well as screenwriting and short films.

With a background in basketball as a college and pro player, Combe enjoyed teaching Denison seminars on the cultural aspects of the game and put his experience into practice as a guest coach for the men's basketball program for several years.

Working across departments and disciplines comes to top of mind as among Kirk's favorite experiences as a Denisonian. Also treasured is his recollection of students filled with unique and exciting ideas. He looks forward now to being able to concentrate on his writing and research full-time, and he plans to spend any remaining bandwidth to enjoy reading spontaneously and biking and hiking the great outdoors.

ANTHONY J. LISSKA

B.A., PROVIDENCE COLLEGE; M.A., ST. STEPHEN'S COLLEGE; PH.D., OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY
PROFESSOR EMERITUS OF PHILOSOPHY

Few educators have had the impact on the Denison community and beyond of Dr. Anthony Lisska. Self-described as a medieval philosopher studying the major philosophers from the time of Augustine up to the rise of Modern Philosophy with Descartes, he first became fascinated with this period of philosophy as an undergraduate student. First educated at Providence College, graduating in 1963 with a degree cum laude in philosophy, he then continued to earn a master's degree from St. Stephen's College and eventually a Ph.D. from Ohio State University, where he worked with Robert G. Turnbull, whom he credits with having a lasting influence on his career. Additional academic accreditation includes a certificate from the Institute for Educational Management at Harvard University.

Throughout his career, Dr. Lisska has published nearly 60 philosophical articles, essays in books, and book reviews, and he has presented work frequently at academic conferences. His scholarly inquiry has focused on the texts of Thomas Aquinas, the great thirteenth-century Aristotelian, while his intellectual interests hone in on regional history. Dr. Lisska has published more than 40 articles on local history, and he co-founded a quarterly titled "The Historical Times" as part of a 15-year involvement with the Granville Historical Society.

Dr. Lisska describes teaching at an undergraduate college like Denison as an early aspiration, and he notes that working with students to help them become connected

with philosophy is an activity he has treasured immensely. He is a recipient of the Sears Teaching Award at Denison, and in 1994 received the Carnegie Foundation United States Baccalaureate Colleges Professor of the Year Award. Dr. Lisska has additionally held an endowed professorship in the Department of Philosophy, as well as the Charles and Nancy Brickman Distinguished Service Chair.

Beyond his work in the classroom, Dr. Lisska has served Denison as dean of the college for a five-year period, chaired the Philosophy Department twice, and served as the founding director of an Honors Program in Gilpatrick House for 15 years. In 2020, Dr. Lisska was honored by Marquis' Who's Who with an Albert Nelson Marquis Lifetime Achievement Award, recognizing remarkable individuals with distinguished lifetimes of achievement. He is founding member of the National Association of Fellowship Advisors, and his name and values will live on through the Lisska Center for Scholarly Engagement, which promotes intellectual dialogue and scholarly excellence on campus by supporting students, faculty, and alumni applying for career and interest advancing opportunities.

In retirement, Dr. Lisska plans to explore the Donald Ross-designed fairways of what is now the Denison Golf Club, and he looks forward to enjoying time spent with his wife of more than 50 years, Marianne, and visiting their grandchildren in San Francisco and Connecticut.

ROBERT STEPHEN RUSSO

B.S., WILMINGTON COLLEGE; M.A., MIAMI UNIVERSITY
PROFESSOR EMERITUS OF HEALTH, EXERCISE, AND SPORT STUDIES

From an early age, Rob Russo remembers his love of sports. His interests ranged from understanding the elements of competition to observing and analyzing the movement of world-class athletes. The mentorship he received in his own academic and athletic development created further resonance and remained a driving force throughout his career.

Russo earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Wilmington College in 1977, where he also played varsity soccer. He then earned his master's degree in health and physical education at Miami University. While there, he began his 42-year coaching career as an assistant and head coach of the men's soccer team.

In 1999, Russo was drawn to Denison after learning of the school's focus on integrating academics and athletics to shape the development of students who are interested in improving society through their experiences both in the classroom and on the playing field.

Russo's leadership at Denison took the Big Red men's soccer team to the NCAA Division III tournament three times, as well as a school-record 18 victories in 2003. Among many additional achievements, he coached 22 All-Region players and 28 First-Team All-Conference players at Denison. With 431 career collegiate wins, he ranks 32nd in victories NCAA men's soccer history, and he is second at Denison.

Russo will most miss working with students and watching their confidence develop and grow, remembering the excitement of each new preseason camp in the fall fondly. In retirement, he will remain involved with the department, continuing to assist the director of athletics with administrative duties.

After his numerous professional accomplishments and accolades as a teacher, mentor, and coach, Russo ends his career with a sense of satisfaction. He looks forward to a new chapter in life, exploring new hobbies and traveling.

LYNDA JOY SPERLING

M.A., M.F.A., EDINBURGH UNIVERSITY; PH.D., UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, SANTA BARBARA
PROFESSOR EMERITA OF ART HISTORY AND VISUAL CULTURE

Joy Sperling has always been fascinated with questions of how visual images claim power. Growing up in wartime Northern Ireland, she was aware from a young age of the impact of competing realities. Beginning her exploration of art through biology further developed an acute awareness of the world and how to make sense of it. Early on, this placed emphasis on observing the tiny visual cues that convey meaning, and it attuned her senses to positions of privilege and power.

At Edinburgh University, Sperling unearthed a fascination with the stories people tell about art, and how dominant narratives often informed by a writer's position in society become the history that lives on. Often working with artists who are marginalized or seen as outsiders, Sperling describes herself not as an art historian but a scholar of visual culture.

Her faculty position at Denison offered Sperling the opportunity to dig deeply into these cultural concepts, which she preferred to the more common scholarly focus on a single artist, period, or theme. Her classes at Denison have explored issues of power and privilege, addressing

how institutions and assumptions create a force in the art world that is too often ignored.

Primarily teaching about modern and contemporary art over three decades, Sperling will most miss the valuable and enlightening conversations that arose in her classroom. She has found throughout her career that insisting on respect and honesty creates the opportunity for students to learn from one another on a remarkably genuine and meaningful level.

Beyond Denison, Joy has maintained involvement with the Popular Culture Association, as well as more than a decade of support with AP Art History at the College Board.

In retirement, she will add to her repertoire of academic publications through current work surrounding the contributions of New Mexico Anglo Women artists to New Mexico's cultural and artistic history and heritage. Joy credits the work of President Weinberg and his administration, as well as the resilience of faculty and staff, especially amid the current pandemic, for her wonderful experience as a Denisonian.

KELLY BROWN DOUGLAS '79, B.S., M.Div., Ph.D.

Kelly Brown Douglas '79 is dean of Episcopal Divinity School at Union Theological Seminary and the Bill and Judith Moyers Chair in Theology at Union. She also serves as the canon theologian at the Washington National Cathedral and theologian-in-residence at Trinity Church Wall Street.

Upon Douglas' appointment at Union, Seminary President Serene Jones described her as "one of the most distinguished religious thinkers, teachers, ministers, and activists in the nation." Prior to Union, Douglas served as professor of religion at Goucher College, where she held the Susan D. Morgan Professorship of Religion and is now professor emerita. Before Goucher, she was an associate professor of theology at Howard University School of Divinity (1987-2001) and an assistant professor of religion at Edward Waters College (1986-1987).

Douglas is widely published in national and international journals and other publications. Her groundbreaking and widely taught book, "Sexuality and the Black Church: A Womanist Perspective" (1999), was the first to address the issue of homophobia within the black church community. Her "Stand Your Ground: Black Bodies and the Justice of God" (2015) examines the challenges of a "stand your ground" culture for the Black church. The publication of her next book, "Resurrection Hope: A Future Where Black Lives Matter," is forthcoming in fall 2021.

Douglas' other books include "The Black Christ" (1994, 25th Anniversary edition 2019), "What's Faith Got to Do with It?: Black Bodies/Christian Souls" (2005), and "Black

Bodies and the Black Church: A Blues Slant" (2012), which seeks to move the Black church beyond its oppressive views toward LGBTQ bodies and sexuality in general.

In addition, Douglas is the co-editor of "Sexuality and the Sacred: Sources for Theological Reflection" (2010). She has been a pioneering and highly sought-after voice addressing sexual issues in relation to the Black religious community. She has also been very active in advocating equal rights for LGBTQ persons.

She is a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Denison University, where she earned a bachelor of science degree summa cum laude in psychology in 1979. She went on to earn master of divinity and doctoral degrees in systematic theology from Union Theological Seminary under James Cone, Ph.D., the premier Black theologian. While at Union, she received The Hudnut Award for demonstrated preaching excellence and the Julius Hanson Award as the outstanding theological student.

A native of Dayton, Douglas was ordained in 1983 at St. Margaret's Episcopal Church in Trotwood, Ohio. She was the first Black woman to be ordained as a priest in the Episcopal Diocese of Southern Ohio and was one of only five nationwide at the time. She also was the first to receive the Anna Julia Cooper Award by the Union of Black Episcopalians (July 2012) for "her literary boldness and leadership in the development of a womanist theology and discussing the complexities of Christian faith in African-American contexts."

Peter Mohler, Ph.D., has been with The Ohio State University since 2011 and serves as the interim vice president for research at The Ohio State University, chief scientific officer of Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center, vice dean for research in Ohio State College of Medicine, and director of the Dorothy M. Davis Heart and Lung Research Institute.

While leading medical research at The Ohio State University, Dr. Mohler worked with teams of creative Ohio State faculty, staff, and trainees, and partners, including Battelle and the State of Ohio, to address and solve a broad range of issues during the pandemic. These included the creation of COVID-19 testing solutions, therapeutic trials, and new diagnostic platforms for the benefit of the citizens of Ohio.

While directing all COVID-19 research operations, including approximately 150 different COVID-related research projects, Dr. Mohler and Ohio State teams helped drive discoveries and solutions to COVID problems in real-time. This included the rapid setup of a massive testing operation that served not only Denison, but the state department of health and county health departments across the State of Ohio. Dr. Mohler and colleagues have also worked with partners across the country and world to introduce these diagnostic and therapeutic innovations more widely.

Dr. Mohler and his Ohio State colleagues have also been diligent in reaching out to smaller, lower-resourced hospitals and organizations across Ohio, working to address and help solve testing-access disparities within underserved communities. They have also provided testing help and resources to Detroit, Chicago, New York City, and Ethiopia.

With the help of Dr. Mohler and his colleagues, Denison University had access this past year to the most current COVID-19 research and developments. He helped design Denison's testing protocol, and by connecting Denison to Ohio State's testing operation, ensured that Denison always had access to high-quality tests and fast results.

Because of the critical expertise and support Dr. Mohler and his team provided Denison, the University was able to navigate this COVID-19 year successfully, and we are deeply grateful.

Dr. Mohler specifically wants to note that he is thrilled to accept this honorary degree on behalf of the team of exceptional individuals at Ohio State and across the state of Ohio who responded to this past year with selfless service to our communities.

ALISON NORRIS, B.A., M.D., PH.D.

ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR, THE OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY
COLLEGE OF MEDICINE AND COLLEGE OF PUBLIC HEALTH

An associate professor of epidemiology at Ohio State University College of Public Health and College of Medicine, Dr. Alison Norris uses multidisciplinary methods to conduct research at the intersection of public health and medicine to understand how social factors, public policy, and decision-making influence health events and outcomes. Her research has traversed HIV/AIDS among migrant workers in Tanzania, the reproductive health needs of rural Malawians in southeastern Africa, and the impact of Ohio law and policy on women's health.

In all these spheres, Dr. Norris's research and insights have helped shape public health decisions and interventions. Partnering with an interdisciplinary team of scientists and health practitioners at Ohio State and in Malawi, Dr. Norris founded the Umoyo wa Thanzi (UTHA) program (Health for Life) in Malawi, which aims to understand factors associated with diminished health among individuals living in this region. Supported by awards from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and Ohio State, the program develops clinical and community-based strategies to respond to health needs.

In the spring of 2020, at the outset of the pandemic, Dr. Norris pivoted to focus her research and to deploy her public health and medical expertise on COVID-19. Dr. Norris served as co-investigator on the statewide prevalence study for the Ohio Department of Health, mobilizing and overseeing teams of field researchers gathering data across the state.

Dr. Norris has focused extensively on the development of COVID-19 management protocols, applying the multidisciplinary tools that have been the hallmark of her research for many years. On top of her research and service to statewide COVID-19 epidemiology work, Dr. Norris helped lead the development of COVID-management protocols for Ohio State, and Ohio public schools, and was instrumental in the development of Denison's case investigation, contact tracing, data analysis, and containment strategies.

Denison is deeply grateful to Dr. Norris for her partnership and support and for the notable wisdom she has brought to this work, born from her longstanding interest in how policies and culture shape behavior and health decisions. In applying her extraordinary expertise and agility as an epidemiologist to COVID-19, Dr. Norris has exemplified research in action and the study of public health as public service.

Dr. Norris notes that her scholarship and her work with Denison have been successful because of the shared efforts of many people contributing their best ideas, determined effort, and goodwill. These skills and collaborations were critical to our success in navigating the pandemic, and she is grateful that this honor extends to all who shared in the labor.

ABIGAIL NORRIS TURNER, B.S., M.S.P.H., PH.D.

PROFESSOR, THE OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY
COLLEGE OF MEDICINE AND COLLEGE OF PUBLIC HEALTH

Dr. Abigail Norris Turner, an infectious disease epidemiologist at Ohio State University College of Medicine and College of Public Health, has spent nearly 20 years characterizing the behavioral, clinical, and immunological factors associated with the acquisition of HIV and other sexually transmitted infections. Her work, carried out in partnership with government and community collaborators, has explored the health concerns of multiple vulnerable populations in a range of settings in the United States and internationally. She has published more than 100 papers, and her research programs and initiatives at The Ohio State University have been awarded extensive funding support from federal research agencies.

With the onset of the pandemic in the spring of 2020, Dr. Turner pivoted to focus her research on the epidemiology of COVID-19 to develop understanding of virus prevalence, transmission, and risk. In collaboration with and in service to the Ohio Department of Health, Dr. Turner led an influential statewide study measuring COVID-19 prevalence in Ohio. Her current public health research is designed to expand COVID-19 testing and vaccination among vulnerable populations across the state, and is also examining the effects of pandemic-related interruptions to critical healthcare. Dr. Turner is also collaborating with colleagues across The Ohio State University to analyze student testing data in order to learn

more about the factors contributing to increased risk for COVID-19 in university students.

In addition to robust COVID-19 research on the epidemiology and public health impacts of the virus, throughout this year of service, Dr. Turner has also devoted hundreds of hours to COVID-19 public education. She has advised organizations, agencies, and public officials on COVID-19 management strategies. She has delivered more than a dozen seminars on the epidemiology of COVID-19 in Ohio, across the U.S., and worldwide.

In applying her extraordinary expertise and agility as an epidemiologist, Dr. Turner has exemplified research in action and the study of public health as public service. Denison has been deeply fortunate to benefit from Dr. Turner's guidance and support in all aspects of COVID management, from data tracking and analysis to health guidelines and containment strategies, to vaccine education.

Dr. Turner believes the pandemic has illuminated the tremendous progress that is possible when collaborative efforts are valued as much as individual achievement. Although Dr. Turner was a visible partner in Denison's COVID-19 response, she gives much credit to the efforts of many people at Denison, at Ohio State, throughout Ohio, and beyond.
