PROGRAM NOTES

Graduates are listed alphabetically under the degree they are receiving, Bachelor of Fine Arts, Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts. In some cases, a student may earn more than one bachelor's degree during his or her undergraduate years. The student's major(s) are listed to the right of his or her hometown, with a concentration indicated within parentheses. Directly below each name is the student's hometown. Titles of yearlong Senior Theses or Senior Creative Projects judged to merit recognition appear in italics underneath the hometown, along with the name and terminal degree of the faculty supervisor.

President's Medalists wear gold medals awarded in recognition of their status. Students graduating *summa cum laude*, *magna cum laude* and *cum laude Latin honors* wear gold, silver and red tassels respectively on their caps. Student members of Mortar Board, a national honor society that recognizes college seniors for their achievements in scholarship, leadership and service, also wear gold tassels on their caps.

Today's processions are selections chosen from *The Water Music* (1717) and *Music for the Royal Fireworks* (1749) by George Frideric Handel (1685-1759). The recessional is a selection from *String Quartet No. 7, K. 160* (1773) by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. *Fanfare for the Class of 2022* is an original composition by Professor of Music Ching-chu Hu, B.A., M.A., M.F.A., D.M.A. Musical selections are being performed by James Van Reeth, violin; Sara Jarecke '25, violin; Sophia Hwang '25, violin; Hayden Bryant '25, violin; Wanling Baker '23,

The commencement orchestra is conducted by Assistant Professor of Music Philip Rudd, B.M., M.M., D.M.A.

Flowers for the program are provided by Village Flower Basket. Interpretive signing is done by Hallenross and Associates, LLC. The program concludes when the platform party and faculty have recessed. The audience and graduates are asked to remain seated during the recessional.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

The academic costume which makes the Commencement procession so colorful is more than 800 years old, dating back to the days when students were members of the minor clergy and wore monkish gowns and hoods. Today, the hood is used only as an ornament. It is lined with the colors of the university conferring the degree: the border in which it is edged indicates the scholar's field. The colors seen in today's Denison procession and the fields they represent are: Dark Blue: Philosophy; White: Humanities; Golden Yellow: Science; Light Blue: Education; Brown: Fine Arts; Pink: Music; Silver Gray: Oratory (Speech); Scarlet: Theology; Lemon Yellow: Library Science; Sage Green: Physical Education; Drab: Commerce, Accountancy, Business.

SUZANNE CONDRAY

B.A., EAST TEXAS BAPTIST COLLEGE; M.A., COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY; PH.D., LOUISIANA STATE UNIVERSITY
PROFESSOR EMERITUS OF COMMUNICATION

Suzanne Condray earned her Bachelor of Arts degree at East Texas Baptist College, followed by a Master of Arts at Colorado State University. She holds her Ph.D. from Louisiana State University. Her own academic experience focused primarily on political communication, which she brought to the Department of Communication at Denison through courses on presidential communication, communication law, race and gender, and media literacy. An academic at heart, she is notably a fourth-generation college professor.

Suzanne discovered a passion for telling stories, particularly of female trailblazers, years after arriving at Denison. Inspired by the life of Licking County native Victoria Woodhull, the first woman to run for president of the United States in 1872, Suzanne took courses from her peers to support this exploration, confirming her commitment to the liberal arts model for higher education. This initial passion soon led to a successful run as an independent videographer, with Condray producing documentaries about Woodhull and another about a team in the first women's professional basketball league in America. While Suzanne was initially interested in teaching at a smaller school for the opportunity to pursue a multitude of interests, the collegiality present at the university became a defining factor for her. Alongside faculty members from the Department of Music and the Department of Cinema, the venerable professor was instrumental in the creation of Denison's Media Technology & Arts major, a popular interdisciplinary program from 1996 to 2007.

Suzanne will miss participating in the empowerment of 18- to 22-year-olds who are just beginning to think critically and the energy of watching them develop new ideas. When her courses overlapped with the political events of 2016, she enjoyed seeing students engage not only with the material but with the world and their reactions to it. In addition to her teaching career, she often supported a group of student advisees each semester from inside and outside the Department of Communication.

In retirement, Suzanne describes looking forward most to the adventure, despite the uncertainty of not returning to school in the fall for the first time since age six. She hopes to connect with former students, put formative academic experiences into writing, and enjoy the time available to travel.

BOB GHILONI

B.S., OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY; M.S., UNIVERSITY OF DAYTON
ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR EMERITUS OF HEALTH, EXERCISE, AND SPORT STUDIES

The chance to coach small-college basketball drew Bob Ghiloni to Denison, who had spent the years prior working with regional high school and larger university teams. His success in the Columbus community led to him being highly regarded in Granville, where he was hired specifically for what he would bring to Denison's student-athletes.

A native of nearby Newark, Bob attended Ohio State University, where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in secondary education. He went on to earn his Master of Science in education from the University of Dayton.

Discovering a love for both basketball and books at an early age, Bob quickly realized he was drawn to coaching and teaching. Looking back on a four-decade career, he feels fortunate to have spent time in both realms.

Bob has served as the head coach of Denison's men's basketball team since 2002, notably leading the program to a third-place conference finish in 2005. Also in 2005, he was named the NCAC Coach of the Year. Under Bob, the DU men made an appearance in the 2012 NCAC Tournament championship game for the first time in school history. Then in 2016, his Big Red returned to win the NCAC Tournament title and advance to the NCAA Championship Tournament. The following year, his leadership led to a school record of 22 games won in the 2016-17 season.

Beyond Denison athletics, Bob taught the History of Sport course in what is now the Health, Exercise, and Sport Studies major for 20 years, and he joined Professor Kirk Combe from the Department of English to offer an immersive seminar exploring basketball through the lenses of culture, gender, and race. He further supported students each semester through advising circles and was a mentor to the first cohort of students who came to campus through the Denison-Columbus Alliance.

From his two decades on campus, Bob will most miss the students, advisees, and players he taught, counseled, and coached. He will affectionately remember the colleagues from whom he learned, but also the facilities staff and custodians who maintained all of the shared athletics buildings and spaces. And he fondly recalls moments when his players came together to recognize one another, celebrating their teammates' achievements as if they were their own.

In stepping away from academics and athletics, Bob now plans on a lot of reading, running, and time spent with family, including his grandchildren. In retirement, he expects to encounter many new experiences related to those that defined his career, such as being involved with athletics, engaging in team-building, volunteering with community improvement, and definitely remaining connected to basketball in some form.

KAREN GRAVES

B.S., M.ED., PH.D., UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS, URBANA-CHAMPAIGN
PROFESSOR EMERITUS OF EDUCATIONAL STUDIES

Karen Graves earned her Bachelor of Science, Master of Education, and Doctor of Philosophy degrees from the University of Illinois. Beginning her teaching career in high school mathematics, she eventually came to Denison, where she found an enduring home in the university's Department of Education.

As professor and department chair, she taught courses in history and philosophy of education, social foundations of education, and queer studies. Among several impressive accolades at Denison and beyond, Karen was honored as holder of Denison's Charles and Nancy Brickman Distinguished Service Chair. In addition, she was the 2019 recipient of the university's Charles A. Brickman Excellence in Teaching Award. She is a past president of the History of Education Society (USA) and a former vice-president (history and historiography) for the American Educational Research Association.

Karen's study broadly examines the foundations of education, exploring how education contributes to our understanding of people and society. Her research addresses 20th-century schooling in the United States with a focus on gender and sexuality, as well as legal policies concerning education. Among her many publications, one of the best known is her 2009 book, *And They Were Wonderful Teachers: Florida's Purge of Gay and Lesbian Teachers*. It received a Critics' Choice Book Award from the American Educational Studies Association in 2010.

Karen feels fortunate to have spent time at a university that not only respects the field of educational studies as an academic discipline but has supported the advancement of teaching, research, and community engagement in the field. Educational studies not only illustrates the efficacy of the liberal arts model but also provides fundamental preparation and versatile career pathways for students.

In the early 2000s, Karen was proud to see Denison's Department of Education transition fully to an educational studies curriculum, a bold move that received support from the university's president and provost, as well as endorsement from faculty across the college. At a critical time for teachers across the nation, Denison's commitment to intellectual integrity further emphasized the importance of a liberal arts approach to the field of education.

From her time at Denison, the venerable professor will look back fondly on the generations of students who embraced Educational Studies in their undergraduate journeys. She looks forward to time spent traveling and thinking and writing in her Writing Shed.

DAVID C. GREENE

B.S., U. OF CALIFORNIA, SANTA CRUZ; M.S., U. OF MASSACHUSETTS, AMHERST; PH.D., U. OF NEVADA, RENO
PROFESSOR EMERITUS OF EARTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCES

David Greene received a Bachelor of Science degree in geology from the University of California, Santa Cruz in 1978. He then went on to earn his Master of Science in geology from the University of Massachusetts, Amherst in 1984, and he was granted his Doctor of Philosophy in geology from the University of Nevada, Reno in 1995. David arrived in Granville as an assistant professor in Denison's Department of Geology in 1996.

A long-standing fascination with solving puzzles about the Earth and a love for working outdoors led David to alternate between the academic study of geology and industrial jobs applying geological principles to solve specific problems. Eventually, he found that he most enjoyed teaching geology and sharing his interest and excitement about the Earth with others.

Throughout his years on The Hill, David offered students introductory and advanced courses in structural and environmental geology, as well as global tectonics. Easy interpersonal connections and camaraderie with intellectually stimulating students and faculty colleagues reinforced his initial enthusiasm for teaching at a liberal arts institution with strong science programs.

Much of David's research explores the development and evolution of structures in eastern Nevada and western Utah, and the structure and stratigraphy of metamorphic roof pendants in the Sierra Nevada of California. Previous scholarship included field research in Greenland and Australia, as well as a sabbatical outreach that taught earthquake-resistant building techniques in rural Guatemala. David is the recipient of several research grants, and a significant percentage of his numerous scholarly publications feature Denison student co-authors, demonstrating his collaborative, inclusive, and personal approach to teaching science — a hallmark of his teaching career.

At Denison, David has greatly enjoyed the opportunity to develop new ideas and new ways of teaching that engage the expertise and perspectives of students and colleagues alike. Departmental field trips, taking professors and geoscience majors off campus to investigate the stories of rocks and landscapes, remain as some of the highlights of his career at Denison.

In retirement, David looks forward to having more time for a wide range of activities, including boat-building and exploring the outdoors with his wife on the coast of Maine.

JOHN L. JACKSON

B.S., MILES COLLEGE; M.Div., HARVARD DIVINITY SCHOOL; PH.D., OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY
ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR EMERITUS OF BLACK STUDIES AND RELIGION

John Jackson's study of Black religion, sociology, and social justice movements was inspired by several distinct yet formative sources. His maternal grandmother provided an early introduction to the contradicting treatment of Africans by European Americans even after the country had achieved independence, while reading James Cone's *Black Theology and Black Power* as an undergraduate student of religion offered transformative academic enrichment. Though he went on to receive a Master of Divinity degree from Harvard Divinity School, apartheid in South Africa further reframed the purpose found in his academic background in religion and sociology beyond involvement with social justice.

John found himself at Denison through a unique opportunity to teach in the classroom while preaching at the college as an associate dean of the chapel and advising student volunteers through the Denison Community Association. Though he planned on a short stay, his presence at the college was extended by a promotion to dean of the chapel in 1978. In the early 1980s, John turned down an offer to return to Harvard to pursue his Ph.D. in theology. Instead, he stayed at Denison to assist in expanding and diversifying Denison's curriculum and department of Black Studies while beginning his doctoral studies at Ohio State.

It isn't easy to recount John's innumerable vital contributions to Denison throughout his 48 years of significant service. He was a founding member of a diverse group of faculty who brought about general education requirements that have transformed Denison's curriculum. Over the years, he brought visiting faculty to campus to teach courses in Black women's studies, culminating in a

full-time tenure-track position for the distinguished Dr. Toni King, associate professor and director of the Center for Black Studies. John additionally brought to campus many key figures from the civil rights movement of the 1960s, including close associates of Martin Luther King Jr.

Later on, John had integral involvement with the Great Lakes Colleges Association's Committee on Institutional Commitment to Educational Equity, a faculty and staff of color organization that went on to sponsor cause-oriented events and provide resources to multicultural committees. In the early 1990s, John was selected to teach the Black religion section of the National Council for Black Studies summer faculty development seminar in Ghana, West Africa. He was one of two faculty members who represented Denison in the inaugural Association of American Colleges and Universities Curriculum and Faculty Development Project in 1993, called "American Commitments: Diversity, Democracy, and Liberal Learning." The project provided a model of diversifying faculty and curriculum for higher education institutions nationwide.

From his tenure at Denison, John will most miss the refreshing engagement of students who re-stimulated his own thinking and learning each year through their understanding of the world, culture, and society. He will additionally miss learning and teaching in a liberal arts setting, with faculty colleagues with whom he shared close work, many laughs, occasional tears, but most of all celebration and joy. He looks forward to experiencing new parts of the world through travel and plans to write a memoir that will further chronicle the history of diversity and the Black Studies program at Denison.

LISA McDONNELL

B.A., CONNECTICUT COLL.; M.A., U. OF NORTH CAROLINA, CHAPEL HILL; PH.D., U. OF NORTH CAROLINA, CHAPEL HILL
ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR EMERITUS OF ENGLISH

Lisa McDonnell received her B.A. from Connecticut College and her M.A. and Ph.D. from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. She is the Dominick Consolo Endowed Professor of English, teaching and publishing in the fields of Renaissance/Early Modern literature and contemporary drama. Professor McDonnell also enjoys teaching classes in Women's Studies, Black Studies, Queer Studies, and First Year Studies. Her research focuses on Renaissance and contemporary dramatists; most recently, she has published ground-breaking work on Shakespeare in China, particularly the adaptation of Shakespeare's plays to the traditional Beijing opera, *Jingju*. Professor McDonnell has also interviewed a number of award-winning contemporary playwrights, including Tony Kushner, Arnold Wesker, Jeffrey Hatcher, and Wendy MacLeod.

For twenty-five years, Professor McDonnell and Professor Burkett led a May Term Travel Seminar to London and Stratford-on-Avon, where students studied plays produced by the Royal Shakespeare Company, the Royal National Theatre, West End and fringe theatres. Professor McDonnell also served as Denison's Exchange Fellow to Advanced Studies in England, exchanging places with an Oxford don for a semester, teaching a course on Renaissance playwrights at ASE in Bath and at Oxford University.

Professor McDonnell has served on numerous committees, most notably Chairing the Academic Affairs Council and Chairing and Vice-chairing the Personnel Committee several times. She is proudest, however, of her decades-long service on the Women's Studies, Queer Studies, and Affirmative Action Committees.

Professor McDonnell is the recipient of the Earl Hartsell Award for Excellence in Teaching, as well as a Certificate of Teaching Excellence awarded by Denison's student body. She has also received the dedication of a Denison University Class Gift.

Professor McDonnell is the recipient of several national research grants, including a National Endowment for the Humanities Grant, a Mellon Foundation Grant, and four Folger Institute Grants. She has also been the recipient of numerous Denison University Professional Development Grants, Course Development Grants, and Diversity Development Grants. She was one of ten scholars chosen from the United States to study Shakespeare collaboratively with members of Britain's Royal Shakespeare Company.

In retirement, Professor McDonnell looks forward to new adventures matching the breadth and energy of her academic career: volunteering, reading, traveling, taking dance classes, attending the theatre, auditing courses-- and perhaps teaching a few. She will miss the intellectual ferment of academic life and the engrossing research that informed her teaching. She will especially miss the engaged interaction she enjoyed so much with her bright and dedicated students.

GILL WRIGHT MILLER '74

B.F.A., DENISON UNIVERSITY; M.A., WESLEYAN UNIVERSITY; PH.D., NEW YORK UNIVERSITY
PROFESSOR EMERITUS OF DANCE

Having attended Denison as a student, Gill Wright Miller has had a flourishing full-time presence at the university since 1981. After graduating with a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in dance performance in 1974, Gill taught briefly as a guest artist before leaving The Hill to earn her Master of Arts in movement studies from Wesleyan University, followed by a Ph.D. in dance education and women's studies from New York University. She returned to Granville in the early 1980s when a newly named department chair who had requested a year's delay on her pending contract subsequently declined the offer, which positioned Gill as a natural fit to be appointed the new chair.

Taking a chance on a modern dance class as an undergraduate at Denison, Gill discovered and fell in love with dance notation, seeing the parallels between its planar geometry and her concurrent coursework in mathematics. In this way, she gained a first-hand appreciation for the unique liberal arts depth offered through the study of dance, crediting this approach with feeling thoroughly prepared to pursue her career in dance, movement analysis, and somatics.

Extending her Denison students a similarly integrated exploration, Gill often brought forth interdisciplinary courses, especially those that ventured into women & gender studies and aesthetic philosophies. While providing a broad examination of dance and related cultural studies, topics also included modernism and postmodernism, the body in performance, and African American concert dance. Whether through the content and methodologies taught or in the discipline of learning something new, she routinely encouraged those in her classes to take risks, remain playful, and investigate further with as much energy as possible.

Gill's personal research continues to engage topics of somatic (experiential) exploration, for which she has received notable grants and recently was granted her Registered Somatic Movement Educator certification. She is a published author of several books and many essays, writing on feminism and somatic praxis, creativity and women in dance, and motherhood, among other themes. In retirement, Gill plans to complete a current book project, continue her study of the Spanish language, and enjoy the company of her children and grandchildren.

LARRY SCHEIDERER

B.S., OHIO UNIVERSITY; M.A., CENTRAL MICHIGAN UNIVERSITY; PH.D., OHIO UNIVERSITY
DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS EMERITUS

Larry Scheiderer was inspired to explore the educational experience associated with athletics by working as a student athletic trainer while pursuing his Bachelor of Science degree in education at Ohio University. An Ohio native, he left the state to pursue his master's degree at Central Michigan University but later returned to earn his Ph.D. from his undergraduate alma mater.

In his time at Denison since 1992, Larry has served as the director of Athletics, Physical Education, and Recreation for 20 years and most recently as director of athletic operations and compliance since 2011.

He was drawn to Granville by the opportunity to develop an athletic program that provided exceptional athletics as an integral part of an outstanding academic experience. As the department's first unified director of athletics, Larry combined four strong departments into a single Department of Athletics, Physical Education, and Recreation — a significant and constructive merger, as students were previously segregated by gender and academic major.

As director of athletics, Larry helped guide Denison's varsity sports programs to a league record of 11 North Coast Athletic Conference All-Sports Championship titles, as well as top-three finishes in the NCAC All-Sports standings for 14 consecutive years. Additionally, the school won 86 conference team championships and two NCAA Division III national championships while he held the position. In 2006 and again in 2011, Larry was named the Division III Athletic Director of the Year by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics.

Under his vision and leadership, Denison was able to undertake and complete three visionary athletics facility projects. The construction of the Mitchell Center's Olympic 200-meter indoor track and tennis courts was a landmark achievement for the university and for Denison athletics. Equally as significant was the addition of the Trumbull Aquatics Center, now one of the premier competition natatoriums in the country. The transformative renovation of Deeds Field and Piper Stadium also moved Big Red athletics exponentially forward. These three major efforts and several other additions and improvements greatly enhanced the resources available to students, coaches, and trainers, and paved the way for future success.

Larry retires from Denison being known for leaving the university and its athletics programs better than he found them. He will most miss celebrating the inspiring achievements of Denison's student-athletes, particularly two national swimming and diving championships. As an advocate and supporter of players and coaches, he is especially proud of the 29 Denison student-athletes who went on to earn the exclusive NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship.

In retirement, he looks forward to spending more time with family and traveling to warmer climes during the winter. He will now be able to follow his grandson's continuing athletic pursuits, as well.

STEVE VOGEL

B.A., YALE UNIVERSITY; M.A., BOSTON UNIVERSITY; PH.D., BOSTON UNIVERSITY
PROFESSOR EMERITUS OF PHILOSOPHY

Steve Vogel began his academic journey as an undergraduate at Yale, studying philosophy and mathematics, as well as political theory. After earning his Bachelor of Arts degree, *summa cum laude*, as a philosophy and mathematics major in 1975, he went on to pursue graduate work at Boston University. While studying philosophy at BU, he quickly discovered his love of teaching. Upon earning his Ph.D. at Boston University in 1984, he was drawn to Denison for the opportunity to teach undergraduates in a liberal arts setting while continuing his scholarly inquiry in different areas of philosophy.

During his time on The Hill, Steve's research focused on environmental philosophy and the works of Marx, Habermas, the Frankfurt School, as well as other thinkers such as Hegel and Heidegger. His published work includes numerous journal articles and two books: *Thinking Like a Mall: Environmental Philosophy After the End of Nature* (MIT Press, 2015) and *Against Nature: The Concept of Nature in Critical Theory* (SUNY Press, 1996).

As a member of the Department of Philosophy faculty at Denison for 38 years, Steve offered students courses in continental and 19th-century philosophy, environmental ethics, political philosophy, and logic. He helped develop and teach courses in Denison's interdisciplinary philosophy, politics & economics major, and greatly enjoyed the pedagogical framework created by combining different academic fields and bringing together students with wide-ranging interests.

Steve has appreciated the intellectual drive of his students, often finding himself learning from their candor and fresh outlook. He was honored with the Charles A. Brickman Teaching Excellence Award at Denison, as well as the John & Christine Warner Professorship and the Nancy Eshelman Brickman Endowed Professor in Memory of Ellenor Shannon. He currently holds the Maria Theresa Barney Chair of Philosophy.

In retirement, Steve plans to travel abroad and spend time with family. He hopes to use his reprieve from grading papers to dedicate himself to additional philosophical writing, including another book to surface soon.

Connie Schultz is a Pulitzer Prize-winning columnist for *USA Today* and author of the *New York Times* bestselling novel *The Daughters of Erietown*. She also is a professional in residence at Kent State University's School of Media & Journalism, where she teaches opinion writing, feature writing, and ethics.

Schultz was a reporter and columnist at *The Plain Dealer* for nearly 20 years, from 1993 to 2011, after working for a decade as a freelance writer. She was a nationally syndicated columnist from 2007 until 2021, when she joined *USA Today*.

In 2005, Schultz won the Pulitzer Prize for Commentary for columns that judges praised for providing "a voice for the underdog and the underprivileged." That year, she also won the Scripps Howard and National Headliner journalism awards for commentary. She has received six honorary degrees and has served twice as a Pulitzer Prize juror.

Schultz is a familiar figure at Denison, where students have learned from her writing expertise as the Dr. Nan Nowik Writer-in-Residence, a program established through the generosity of Denison Alumni Council Trustee Kathryn Correia '79 and Stephen Correia, as well as the Andrew W. Mellon Storyteller-in-Residence, funded through a combination of a grant from the Mellon Foundation and a gift from Denison alumna Sue Douthit O'Donnell '67.

In 2003, Schultz was a Pulitzer Prize finalist in feature writing for her series, *The Burden of Innocence*, which chronicled the ordeal of Michael Green, who was imprisoned for 13 years for a rape he did not commit. A week after publication, the real rapist turned himself in after reading her series. Schultz won several awards for this work, including the Robert F. Kennedy Award for Social Justice Reporting and the Batten Medal.

Schultz has been featured for her work in numerous publications and interviews, including *The New Yorker*, NPR, *Politico*, *Kirkus Reviews Magazine*, *Glamour*, *Columbia Journalism Review*, *The Washington Post*, and *Ohio Magazine*. Her book reviews appear regularly in *The Washington Post*, and she has also written for *The New York Times*, *Politico*, *Parade*, *The Atlantic*, *Time*, *The Nation*, *Glamour*, *Democracy Journal*, and *ESPN Magazine*, among others.

In addition to *The Daughters of Erietown*, Schultz is the author of a collection of essays, *Life Happens – And Other Unavoidable Truths*, and a memoir about her husband Sherrod Brown's successful 2006 race for the U.S. Senate, *...and His Lovely Wife*. She has contributed to several anthologies, including *The Speech: Race and Barack Obama's A More Perfect Union*, and more recently wrote the foreword to the 2020 anthology, *Midland: Reports from Flyover Country*, edited by Michael Croley and Jack Shuler. Her first children's book, *Lola Trains the Trolls*, will be published by Razorbill Books in the summer of 2023. She is currently working on her next novel.
